SUBJECT: Members of the Military Processed under Ato Institucional

REF : Embassy's A-1345 of May 14, 1964

Since the April 1 revolution, forty members of the Armed Forces have been deprived of their political rights for a period of ten years under the provisions of Article 10 of the Ato Institucional. This number includes Sergeant Antonio Garcia Filho and Brigadier Epaminondas Gomes dos Santos, both of whom also had their mandates as federal deputies cancelled (see referenced airgram). Since military men and ex-military men frequently move into other areas of activity subsequent to or in addition to their military duties, only those individuals who were primarily militarists or who were on active duty are discussed in this airgram. Enclosure (1) gives information about these Article 10 personalities.

Since the revolution, one hundred and forty-six military officers have been transferred to reserve status under the provisions of Article 7 of the Ato Institucional. Enclosure (2) lists these officers by name and gives partial political information on some of the individuals concerned.

Ninety-three enlisted members of the Marine Corps have also been expelled from their service under the sanctions of Article 7. The apparent charges against these individuals is either that they participated in the September 1963 Brasilia uprising, acted as bodyguards for Leonel Brizola and/or took part in the late-March Sergeant's Club strike in Rio. Enclosure (3) lists these persons.

Enclosure (4) is a May 13, 1964 O Globo article listing the military figures being held by the Brazilian Air Force in the Marshal Hermes Prison in Rio. A cross-comparison of the enclosures will reveal some overlap, particularly between Article 10 cases and the list of military officers who were retired (Enclosures 1 and 2).

Comment: The Embassy has not undertaken to determine the reasons which may have motivated the revolutionary authorities to act in the individual cases. Most of those whose political rights have been suspended are well and unfavorably known to the Embassy and the Department. The general assumption is that the officers involved made up the core of the erstwhile Goulart military dispositivo. The enlisted members affected were those who were prominent in leftist political activity, at times counter to the desires of even some of Goulart's military advisors, which eventually culminated in the revolution-igniting Rio revolt in late March.

The Embassy appreciates the full cooperation give by the Service Attachés and CAS Rio in assembling this report.
